

## Cost of Living in Australia

In general terms you will find living in Australia is cheaper than in most European countries. The standard of living is high and dining out is a frequent event rather than a special occasion!

Tickets to go to the cricket at the MCG start from as little as \$25, a whole day pass for the Australian Tennis Open (excluding Centre court) cost \$27 for an adult and you can go to see an AFL game for around \$15. Movie tickets are approximately \$15 and tickets for concerts are around \$60 upwards.

The capital cities in Australia have frequent “festivals” where you can experience a wide range of performers and cultural experiences and the tickets are very competitively priced.
